MEETING MINUTES

The December meeting was called to

order at 8:15 PM by Vice President Tom Raffaelli, WB2NHC.

Publicity Director NW2L indicated that press releases had been sent out and flyers distributed for the showing of the movie at the meeting. Rich also provided further details on the upcoming Hudson Division Convention to be held in conjunction with WECAFEST '88.

County Liaison N2SF indicated that the parts for the Motorola repeater had been ordered. He also reported that THE NEXT VOLUNTEER EXAMINER SESSION WOULD BE HELD ON JANUARY 21ST AT 7:30 PM AT BOC. Also, the next Indian Point Drill would be held during the week of March 20th and anyone needing a letter to take time off from work should contact Jim. A new tower and radio room will be built near the old site to make room for the new addition to the jail.

Digital Modes-WB2QJA and WB2IXW reported that the new digi-WB2Z11-5 was on the air on 145.09. It is for local use. Note that a new version of software is running on WB2QJA-4 FBBS. Users can download 'HELP.MB' for the new commands.

Technical, AC2T indicated that he has been working on repairing the Motorola and is just awaiting parts. Director-at-large, K2ZVI indicated that additional help with traffic is needed on SEN.

Membership, AC2V announced the calls of those applying for membership. They were approved unanimously. Activities, N2HGR indicated that help was still needed for Blythedale.

New Business:

Bylaws committee chairman WB2NHC announced that the committee had reached an impasse on the question of honorary membership as had been reported in last month's newsletter. A vote of the membership was taken and the overwhelming majority (12 to 1) voted that the selection of honorary members remain with the executive board.

Rich, NW2L presented the ARRL video, "The New World of Amateur Radio". The meeting was adjourned at 9:40 PM.

Greetings to all. I hope you enjoyed the Holidays and the New Year finds you safe and well! Did you get any packet goodies for Christmas or Hanukkah?

I plan to publish the results of the packet poll in next month's column, so if you haven't filled out your questionnaire yet, please do it soon and get it to me.

This month I would like to bring you up to date on what is going on, on the BBS and on the packet network. First of all, WB2QJA-4 is now using version 98K of the KATS PRMBS software. Version 1.00 will be on the way soon and will be released nationally probably via CompuServe. Many thanks to both Brian, KA2BQE, and Dave, NN2Z, who developed the software. As many of you know, The PRMBS BBS software is more user friendly than the comparable WA7MBL version. There are many new commands on the BBS. If you are unsure of the correct command syntax, you can type "?" for a menu or "cmds" for the list of commands that you can use. To list the most recent calls heard/connected, "J" has been replaced by "HEARD".

If, when you sign onto the BBS, you are informed that you have mail, just enter the command "MAIL". You will see a list of messages waiting for you with a "*" before message that is unread. You then get a short "E,K,R,S,V,cr,t,-".

"E" is to edit the message header. Say for example, if you received an interesting message and want to redirect it to someone else.

"K" is to kill the message.

"R" or "V" allows you to read/view the message; the difference is that if you view the message, you will see all the forwarding headers while if you read the message, you will not.

"S" will send a reply back to the person who sent the original message to you.

"CR" stands for carriage return and allows you to skip over that message.

"-" changes directions and lets you go backward to the previous message.

"+" is opposite and lets you go forward to the next message.

A word about traffic. If you use packet to enter NTS traffic, use the "ST" and "KT" commands to send and kill traffic respectively. The "T" tells the BBS and the "system" that the message is NTS traffic and handles it a bit differently. If your traffic is picked up from a BBS which supports this, a service message will be generated back to you telling you who picked up the traffic, from where, when. Nice! It looks like zip codes are in and telephone area codes are out for routing of NTS traffic. If you are sending traffic via packet and do not know the call of the BBS serving that area, send the traffic this way: ST NTS @ ZXXXXX

The "XXXXX" stands for the zip code. This will ensure that your message is route quickly and doesn't need to wait for the sysop of the BBS to re-address it for you. This BBS will automatically forward any such addressed traffic.

Don't forget about the "HOME" command. You can use this command two ways. You can query the BBS to see if you have entered this yet and what you have entered, or you can enter "HOME RBSCALL" to set your home BBS. You should do this on all BBSs you check into. This way, all mail for you will be automatically shipped to one location. If you want to check your statistics re: how many times you have signed in, etc., enter the "USER" command. If you want to see if someone else uses the BBS or when was the last time he or she signed in, enter "USER XXXXXX" where "XXXXXX" is the call you are interested in.

There is a great new file called "USER.DOC" which has been prepared by WB2ENA for users of the PRMBS system. Download this file (D USER.DOC) for detailed information about all user commands.

Great things are afoot for creating a better and more reliable packet network. RATS is supposed to release its COSI level 3 software sometime in January. This promises to be a more advanced network than NETROM. Several

of the people running the area nodes held a meeting in December which was attended by Al, WB2IXR. There are plans to put a 220 and 440 MHz backbone on the air for the current 2 meter nodes. WECA may be involved with this by placing a node on 220 after the New Year.
