Dear WECA:

Remember me? I'm the guy that took those pictures at Field Day that have become such an integral part of Tom's Field Day power point presentations.

Well, I am in big trouble now. I need a place to live. I am essentially homeless hold up in a hotel in Lyndhurst, New Jersey. Living in this hotel costs three times my income.

Last April I went into the hospital for the very first time to have an operation to reconstruct my right foot. I was told that me stay would be lengthy, so I gave up my apartment. I have been in and out of hospitals and rehabs ever since. However, my treatments have now come to an end. I am not sick enough to be in a hospital, and I am no longer eligible for Medicaid. This precludes me from getting into an assisted living facility which is actually what I really need.

I am writing to ask if anyone can help me either find a suitable living arrangement or a source of funds to fend off the expense of living in this hotel. Once a living arrangement is found, I



will need help moving my property from a storage facility. When I am back in my own environment with my computer I will be able to start making a living once again.

Do you want New York State Funding BPL in Westchester County?

Send a letter to help us fight

The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) has agreed to provide up to \$200,000 in funding in support of a Broadband over Power Lines (BPL) project in Westchester County, New York. The project has been the source of documented harmful interference to radio communication frequencies in Briarcliff Manor, New York since July 2003. The ARRL has complained repeatedly about the interference, most recently on January 5, 2006 (see <http://www.arrl.org/news/stories/2006/01/06/3/>). NYSEDA has been aware of the problematic nature of the Briarcliff Manor installation since June 2004 but elected to go ahead with its funding anyway.

The Briarcliff Manor BPL system is violating the FCC rules in three ways: 1) it is exceeding the absolute emission limits set out in Part 15 of the FCC rules; 2) it is causing harmful interference to amateur radiocommunication; and 3) it is not listed in the BPL database, www.bpldatabase.org

If you share our dismay that NYSEDA's funds are being used to support a known source of radio spectrum pollution, write to Governor Pataki, NYSEDA President Peter Smith and Con Ed to demand that the State of New York use its influence to ensure that the Briarcliff Manor BPL project is either brought into compliance with the FCC rules immediately, or shut down. 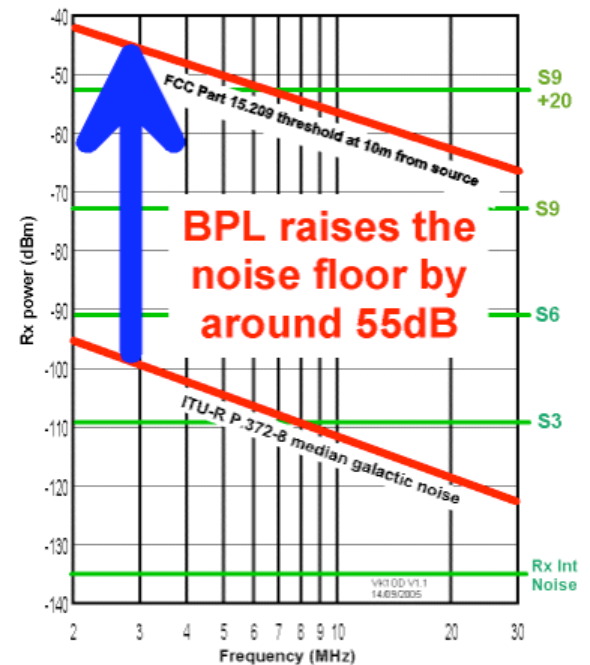

Broadband over power lines (BPL) is a technique for transmission of high speed data (broadband Internet) over powerlines. Access BPL technology injects radio frequency energy into powerlines which were not designed for transmission of radio frequency energy, and leak substantial energy that causes interference to radiocommunications services

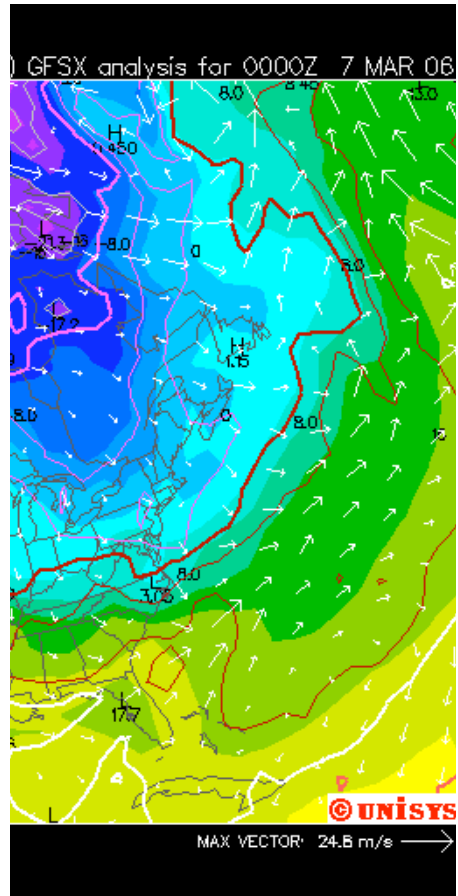
It's a new year... So time for a new look
